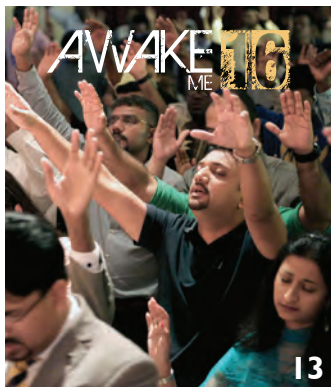
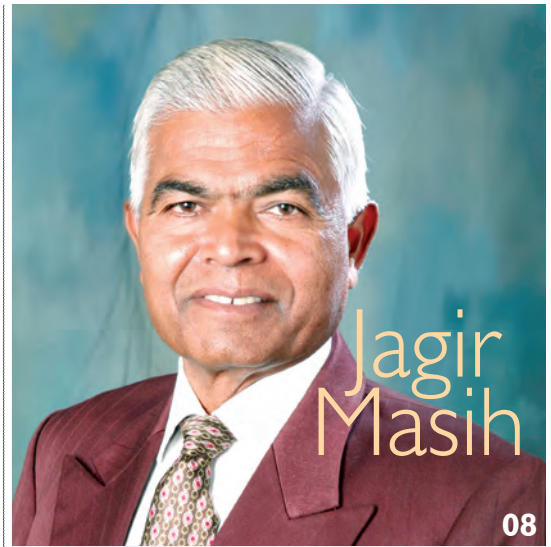

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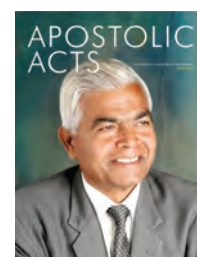

GOD'S

Demonstration

TAMI has been blessed with a Word for the year 2016: the year of expansion and new territories. Let me add a Word that God gave me after many days of waiting before the dawn of the New Year. It came as part of a powerful dream and words were dropped into my spirit. The year 2016 will also be the year of God's demonstration. The word demonstration, which in the Greek is the word, 'apodeixis'. It is part of a courtroom language. It simply means furnishing proof for a truth that is already presented. Paul uses this in 1 Corinthians 2:4 when he spoke about the "demonstration of the Holy Spirit and power".

Demonstration is not the reinventing of truth but the supplying of proof to truths that already exist. We know God can save. He can heal. He can deliver. He can do mighty things and nothing is impossible with Him. He is the Provider, Protector and He is always faithful to His promises. He does not change and His Words will never fail. These are immutable truths which need no embellishment. However, this year the Lord promised me that He is going to demonstrate the truths. Hallelujah!

Do you know that power cannot be seen but can only be demonstrated? Just like the radio waves or television waves it can only be understood when it is demonstrated. When the Bible talks about power we need to see the outcome of it as its demonstration. If the outcome does not happen, it simply means that power was not released or there is a serious impediment.

Look at the way power was demonstrated in the Bible:

1. The Gospel is called the Power of God unto SALVATION - Romans 1:16. People being saved and transformed is the demonstration.
2. Power was released from Jesus Christ - Luke 8:42-48. Demonstration - A woman who was suffering with the issue of blood for twelve years was instantaneously healed. Healing, I mean of all kinds of sickness, is a demonstration of power.
3. The disciples gave witness to the resurrection with great Power - Acts 4:33 - mighty witnessing is a demonstration of Power.
4. Jesus said, "Behold, I give unto you power to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy..." - Luke 10:19. Victory over Satan and destroying his power and kingdom is a sure demonstration of power.
5. Stephen was full of power and faith - Acts 6:8. Walking in and exercising of faith is a demonstration of power

Yes church, we need to see demonstration or else our words are just "enticing words" of human persuasion and as such is no match against the demonstration of evil being unleashed across the globe.

But the fact remains, God wants to demonstrate Himself, His might, His power and His incomparable Glory in and through our lives and across the globe. Oh how I long to be the display chamber of His Spirit's demonstration and Power. I am assured that I will be a demonstration of His faithfulness even as He made me a demonstration of His goodness.

Let us live the gospel and proclaim it

At The Apostolic Ministries International, we are committed to Jesus Christ, to proclaim the gospel, in season and out of season—we announce the good news of what Christ has done for all humanity. But the gospel is not just words to pronounce—it also involves practical application in our lives. The gospel of grace is a life to be lived!

From the time we step into the gospel of grace, the blessed Holy Spirit affects the way we think and the way we live. When we realize that we are sinners saved only by God's mercy & grace, we become more patient with other sinners. When we realize that we have been forgiven an enormous number of sins, we become more forgiving. The better we understand and appreciate the grace shown us, the more gracious we become toward others. We see the need for forgiveness in ourselves and in others. The revelation of the gospel impacts the way we live our daily lives.

However, the more we see the need to be like Christ, the more we see how inadequate we are to this calling. We do not forgive as well as we should, or as well as we want to. We continue to need forgiveness for our lack of forgiveness, as well as our many other shortcomings. We do not find it in ourselves to do what we know we should. As Paul said – I do the things I do not will to do.

So we look to God for the strength to forgive, and the desire to forgive. This is a learning and growing process, not achieved all at once. We look to God to change not just what we do, but who we are and how we think and what we value.

In this often-slow process of change, we need to trust Christ. We need to trust that he will, in his own time, make us like himself. We need to trust that he will change others, too. Although the church and its members are not perfect, and although they disappoint us and sometimes even hurt us, we need to trust Christ to do his work in them just as he does his work in us. We are all sinners on the journey together. We are work-in-progress.

What I have discovered is that the more and more I can live the gospel, the easier it is to proclaim the gospel, with conviction! We have 25 mission fields with over 3000 evangelists. My word of encouragement to all of you is that we should live the gospel and proclaim it. If we forgive and proclaim the forgiveness of God, people will hear us. If we rejoice and ask people to rejoice in the Lord, they will respond.

A good example, however, helps the gospel to be favorably received. That is one of the dynamics at work in friendship evangelism. People can be won to Christ in only a few words after they have seen some good examples of the gospel in action. As Paul wrote, "Conduct yourselves in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ. Some behaviors are worthy of the gospel, and some are not. Our example is important. "Our lives should reflect the gospel! We are the only good news many people may ever read! One person who has lived the gospel is Jagir Masih from Punjab. We have included his cover story in this issue of the 'Apostolic Acts'. There are so many heroes in TAMI like Jagir Masih and my prayer for you is that you will be a legacy in the Kingdom of God!



Jagir Masih

I was born on 13 July 1943 in a village called Bhatnura Kalan in Punjab.

My father's name was Babu Ram and he was in the army. I got my basic education and then my father got me employed in the Electricity Board. I worked there till 1968. In 1970, my father started a small shop for me, where I sold electrical parts. One day as I sat in my shop, I saw a friend of mine passing by with his wife. I called him over and invited him for a drink at a shop close by. He came to me but when I picked up a bottle of liquor and poured him a drink, he refused, saying that he had stopped drinking and that he had accepted the Lord in his life.

Now I had known this man for a long time. He was not only a friend but a relative of mine. I knew he used to drink a lot. I knew he enjoyed drinking. Listening to him talk now, I was very impressed and felt that if he could give up drinking, so could I. I asked him how he had given up drinking and where had he gone to seek help. He said he was going where listening to a word would clean your life of all these habits. I went with him – it was a gathering of Christians. A Canadian lady, Sister Alice was preaching a sermon on Galatians 5:17-22

¹⁷ For the flesh desires what is contrary to the Spirit, and the Spirit what is contrary to the flesh. They are in conflict with each other, so that you are not to do whatever[a] you want. ¹⁸ But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law. ¹⁹ The acts of the flesh are obvious: sexual immorality, impurity and debauchery; ²⁰ idolatry and witchcraft; hatred, discord, jealousy, fits of rage, selfish ambition, dissensions, factions ²¹ and envy; drunkenness, orgies, and the like. I warn you, as I did before, that those who live like this will not inherit the kingdom of God. ²² But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness

She said that those who followed fleshly acts, would not enter heaven and she spoke about spirit and body. That Word spoke to me – I saw all those evil acts of flesh in my own life – drunkenness, lying, anger, abusive behavior – I identified with it immediately, because all of this was present in my life. After the meeting, I spoke to the sister and asked her many questions that this Word had raised within me and she reiterated that anyone who fulfilled the desires of the flesh could never enter heaven. That night, I repented of my sins and asked Lord Jesus to come into my life.

When I allowed Jesus in, I felt something huge had just exit my life. I felt very light as if a burden had been lifted off me. I went home and shared my experience with my family. They listened but were skeptical about how it might change my life. As the days went by, they noticed a change in my behavior and my speech. I started spending time in reading the Word of God. As I drew closer to the Word, my shop was getting neglected and the elders in the house started asking me how I was planning to sustain my life – the shop would remain closed since I was spending much of my time in prayer. I had been married just 3 months and these were genuine concerns of my family members. After 6 months of being married, I was asked to leave the joint family and look after my wife and myself – this was done with the intent of making me responsible for my family.

I started spending longer hours in prayers – those days I would walk long distance away from my home and pray. In those days, Christianity was new to our community and to our state, Punjab. We had no exposure to Christians before this. As my interest in the Word grew, I received water baptism and I started going to remote places with the Pastors to preach the Word. My brothers who had separated me from the family to make me independent, were very upset with me. They were worried how I would survive and look after my wife. They came over to our house along with my wife's family and started questioning and counselling me. I stayed quiet and did not say anything. Finally when they asked me to say something, I said "I do not have any answers to any of your questions, but I only know one thing – I have fallen in love with Yesu Masih, I consider it an honor and privilege to learn about His Word – I cannot leave Him because having tasted His Word, everything else around me now seems worthless and insipid in comparison to Him."

I continued going with Pastors, learning more about the Word – in April 1971, I returned home after spending 6-7 days of prayer meetings, and as usual my family ignored me. So I went and lay down on a charpai (wooden bed) in the courtyard – it was around 7:30 pm and I had a vision. I remember clearly that I was not asleep – I had this vision wide awake. I could clearly see an angelic being descending from the sky. He had a package in his hand and he gave it to me. I refused to take the package because I was not sure what was inside the package. I told him to give it to my older brother since he was more educated than me. The angel left and returned within a split second. He said he had orders from above to deliver the package to me – he told me that the package had a fish net to catch fish and wherever I spread this net, I would catch fish. This has been sent only for you and not for your brother. I was sweating profusely as I ran to my pastor and narrated this incident to him. Pastor told me that the Lord had now separated me and summoned me into His service.



I went home and told my wife that I was going to fast and pray for the next three days and that she should not disturb me. I did not eat or drink anything because I wanted God to speak to me. I just spent time praying and seeking the Lord. Nothing happened for the first two days and then on the third day as I opened my Bible to read, I could not read anything – it was not visible. I thought it could be weakness due to fasting, so I continued praying and asking the Lord what was happening. When I opened the Bible again, I could read clearly. I prayed for some more time and the third time when I opened the Bible, my eyes sighted upon the Word that I will always remember as long as I live. It was from Isaiah 41:10

¹⁰ So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand.

That Word seemed to cover the entire page. I read the Word and closed my eyes – I felt the Word come out of the Bible and enter me. I am not so well educated, but as the Word entered me, I suddenly felt free from every fear and insecurity. I then decided I would serve the Lord all my life.

Even today, I remember that vision and that Word – wherever I go, the Lord prepares the place for me. I have been to places where no one had ever preached Jesus before and I have reaped a harvest of souls in the most barren of places. I stand in wonder and amazement at the way, churches have come up

in remote places – this has constantly encouraged me in my walk with Christ. There have been difficulties too, but God has been faithful and I have felt closer to Him during those tough times. After every tough period, we have seen great joys and breakthroughs. I have gone into the mouth of death and returned.

When I started serving the Lord, I had no source of income. So I had to sell the house that I had received from my father as inheritance, to my brother. Once the sale was done, my brother asked me to vacate the house in due time. In 1977, we had to leave our house and get a house on rent. I did not know what to do and where to go – I just wanted to share the Word with someone. It was a hot summer day and I hung a bag around my neck, with the Bible inside it. As I walked some distance, I met a young boy, riding a bicycle who asked me where I was going. When I told him that I did not know where, but that I only wanted an opportunity to share the Word, he told me that his uncle had a Bible too and whenever he came home, he shared the Word from the Bible with his parents. This boy invited me to come home and share the gospel with his parents. I was so excited – instead of walking, I was now riding behind this young boy and looking forward to sharing the Word – the family welcomed me. I received the water they gave me, with a prayer of thanks and preached a message to them. There was a young girl in that family who was very sick for the past two months. She had not been eating anything and the doctors had given up on her. Her family could not bear to see her so sick and they said to me – “Please pray that God either heals her or takes her away”. I told them that my God only gave life not death. As I started praying, within fifteen minutes, the girl asked for some food (this was the first time she ate in two months). She was completely healed. I had prayed with faith and fearlessly because since the Word had entered me, I no longer had any fear. I knew boldly and confidently that my God would do this for me.

The next day, the young boy reached my rented house. He brought two vessels full of milk and yogurt. Since then, the Lord has always provided faithfully for my family. Our family statement is: "We know that the Lord is bigger than our needs". Wherever I have undergone difficulty to plant His Word, I have seen tremendous growth and springs of water come up. I have gone around villages and small towns carrying a loud speaker in my hand, preaching the Word. At times people were resistant – in 1980, two brothers who hated me preaching the gospel, ran their vehicle over me – my bones were shattered and deranged, my body was limp and my companion pastor was badly injured. Even as someone rushed me to the hospital, they thought I was dead since I was motionless. God brought me out of death and I went right back to preaching.

In the same year, I had gone to attend a meeting with another Pastor, when we were surrounded by Sikh terrorists. They stopped our bike and held their guns on our neck. Suddenly there was a big sound, and these terrorists got very scared (that was the time when Sikh militancy was at its peak and the terrorists feared nothing) – these "fearless" men were running in great fear in different directions. We reached the meeting and all of us gave thanks to our faithful God for saving our lives. In another city, Gurdaspur, in a church meeting, we again encountered terrorists, but the Lord was always good and once again no harm came upon us. Psalm 116:15 "Precious in the sight of the LORD is the death of his saints." He saved us many times over. Once a mob surrounded our car in Orissa, and was about to set it ablaze; within seconds the driver was able to steer us out into safety. A few moments and we would have been burnt alive. Truly through the valleys of shadow of death, God has kept us safe and unharmed. My faith kept increasing as I saw His goodness and His faithfulness. Christians in Orissa have faced death, torture, torment and severe oppression. One night as we were dining at a restaurant which belonged to a Shiv Sena chieftain, they noticed the Bibles in our hands and surrounded us. They were joined

by many more who wanted to kill us. I still marvel how the Lord got us out of that mob safe and secure. Our ministry in Orissa continues to grow and flourish.

More recently, in Jamalpur, Punjab, a child died of electrocution within our church premises. His family that belonged to an opposing faith, came up in arms and surrounded my entire family. I had to call the police to get my family members out safely. I keep remembering the Word He gave me "Do not fear for I am with you", truly I have nothing to fear. I keep busy serving Him and moving ahead. Even in the midst of my problems, I am victorious. I am 74 years now but I feel younger than even before.

Where there was nothing.....

The Pentecostal movement started way before the CNI and Catholic churches in Punjab. It has been less than fifty years. I am blessed to have been a part of those elders of the Pentecostal movement. Initially this movement was restricted to the cities but when the Holy Spirit began sweeping over the land, we elders started going where the Spirit led us – we went to places that had never heard of Jesus – Beas, Nadalipind, Saleempur, Ranipind, Bholath, Talwara, Fatehpur are just a few of them. We have churches and cell groups in these places. We uprooted idol worship and led people to the one true God. We worked among various communities.





My Family

My family and I have learnt at the feet of God, that prayers are our wings. We can only move ahead through prayers. When I saw that our victories were a direct result of the time spent on our knees in prayer, I started thinking about a prayer tower. In 2005, we started a 24 hour Prayer Tower. That year was a defining moment of my ministry. I met TAMI leader Pastor Alias in October and our Ministry grew since then. Together, we have started many churches and cell groups across 10 states in India – Punjab, Haryana, Rajasthan, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu and Kashmir, Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, Orissa, Maharashtra. We have evangelists, mission workers in many cities. In Hoshangabad, Madhya Pradesh, are planning to start a church. One of our mission workers has already started work there. Wherever we preach, evil spirits flee, people are set free and the Lord does great wonders.

My Wife

I would like to say something about my wife – since 17th April 1970, through the plan of God, I got married to the best life partner that I could ever have. Her name was Deep which means

“Light”. She was the light that brightened my ministry and proved to be a huge support for my work. She was everything that Proverbs 31:14-19 says a woman should be – She was a woman of prayer. She sold all her gold jewellery and gave that money to support my ministry. She always helped the poor and needy with whatever resources that we had. She supported my decision to sell our house to raise money for our crusades and meetings. We went through many troubles and problems but she always stood by my side. God blessed us with two daughters and a son. She was suddenly taken away from us as she prayed at 6 am on 19th November 1991 – no illness or suffering – she passed away peacefully without any illness, having served her God and her ministry faithfully and completely.

My Plans for the Future

Since 2016, we want to work even harder with TAMI. We have 300 pastors and we want to baptize at least 2000 people this year. We want to build 3 more churches in India, especially in new regions. Our desire is to have 6 crusades in this land. We want to start a school here and also to buy new land for our churches. Please keep us in your prayers as we continue to serve the Lord and grow spiritually day by day.

21 DAYS FASTING PRAYER


This year, the AWAKE ME (Awake Middle-East) Breakthrough Fasting and Prayer commenced on 9th Jan 2015. Our 21 days of Fasting Prayer always signify setting aside each day to diligently pray for one Middle-east nation. This has been an immense privilege as we believe the importance that these nations collectively hold in the second coming of Jesus Christ.

Pastor Alias encouraged the church on having a keen desire to obey God with utmost devotion. Without obedience, it is impossible for us to totally walk in the will of God. Our faith in God is being tested through obedience. Just like Jesus obeyed unto the Cross, we too are called to reflect His nature, by recklessly obeying the Word of God that transform our lives.

Today, I know how to boldly deal with any kind of fear than I would have in the past. All glory to God for revealing solutions through His servants from the Bible.

Personally I felt this time's fasting prayer was very different from the ones that were held during the last few years. For instance, even in the fasting prayers that were held in the past, I have attempted to go for the morning prayer which is normally held at 5:00 AM. I would start off with vigor but within a few days it would become so difficult to drag myself out of bed and I would eventually just stop going. But for the first time this year, I attended the morning prayer every single day and I found myself looking forward to it with an expectation. I believe the thirst for coming together for intercession in the morning prayer was a fruit that was birthed out of the Night Vigil. Every day I would wake up at 4:00 AM to be at church on time for the 5:00 AM prayer and it was a great feeling to come together with the Saints of God and begin your day with prayer.

Even in the meetings that were held in the evening, there was a consistency in the messages that were preached and a definite move of the Holy Spirit. In some of the meetings especially there was a tangible move of the Holy Spirit. I could sense power when I claimed whatever was preached over my own situation or over the situations of people known to me. There was a feeling of being GOD-CONFIDENT and you would be pumped up by the end of the meeting.

Something profound which the Lord reminded me during the fasting prayer was a message that was preached by Ps. Anison maybe a year or two ago. He had preached a message that throughout the bible the number 10 was of significance to the Lord. We see in the bible many times that after the accomplishment of the number 10 (be it 10 years, 10 generations etc..) something significant would happen and there would be a major shift in that particular situation or scenario. The first Middle East Breakthrough prayer took place in March 2006 and we are in 2016 now. It's been 10 years that we have been steadfastly having the fasting prayer and I would like to end with a note of declaration by faith that something profound is going to happen this year because it's a time for an upward shift for TAMI and for the Middle East!

What fasting can do, one can only understand when they fast in true spirit. I never liked fasting and would often ask myself, "Why should I fast?" Fasting was a challenge for me, even as a Catholic.

I have been in the Apostolic International ministries for the past six years and am the oldest member of the Hindi Apostolic Church. I remained faithful to the Apostolic Church, but fasting was not my interest all these years.

In January 2016, I decided to find out what God's will for me in my life was. In order to find God's will for me, I decided to fast for 21 days along with my wife Freeda. During this period, I experienced God's grace and love in my life. Every word that came out from the mouth of the every preacher pierced my heart. I felt as if the preacher was speaking to me.

Thursday 28th of January 2016, late that evening after prayer, I asked pastor Alias to pray for me. As he prayed over me I felt electricity passing through my body. That same night, Jesus appeared to me in a dream. He laid his hands on my head and commissioned me to do his work. I did not agree with the Lord, and said to Him, "I am a sinner and not worthy. I am not even prepared to do your work". I told Jesus about my problem, my children's education, plans for their future. But the Lord took me to Calvary where he bled

I minister in labor camps along with other believers and even evangelize at my workplace.

I am hungry today, not for food but for God's work. I have experience Jesus and I want to demonstrate this to others. I want to bring joy to others by showing them the love of Christ. One person that has greatly influenced my life is pastor Alias. He trusted me, prayed for me and above all loved me. I lost my biological father 12 years ago but now I found not only Jesus but a spiritual father in my Senior Pastor. Hallelujah!

UGANDA MISSIONS

(Leadership Seminar & Ordination function at Pallisa, Uganda.)

The Leadership Seminar and Ordination function held at Palissa town, Uganda was truly a blessed event for all those who attended. It was a great time of fellowship and meaningful interactions between leaders from Uganda and neighboring countries. We genuinely experienced the hospitality and love of the people. The function was held between 9th & 11th of October 2015.

The Leadership seminar was aimed at training church leaders (elders & pastors) of TAMI in Uganda. There were delegates from 33 churches which are under the leadership of Pastor Ekopai. There were pastors from neighboring countries also attending the functions. Bishop John Weweru and wife from Kenya, Pastor Rodney from Zanzibar, Pastor Laylay from Burundi, Pastor Alias and Pastor Pratibha Rao from UAE were present as leaders of this seminar and function. The theme of the Seminar was "Overcoming obstacles in ministry". The teaching sessions

Ethiopia

Bible School

Ethiopia is one of the largest nations in the African continent and has significance in the Biblical context.

Formerly known as Abyssinia, Ethiopia descended from “Cush” of the Bible. God’s promise concerning the future of Ethiopia, in Psalm 68:31 is that Ethiopia (Cush) will quickly stretch out her hands to God.

In The New Testament, Philip the Evangelist was told by an angel to go down to the road from Jerusalem to Gaza, there he meets an Ethiopian eunuch. As the eunuch was sitting in his chariot reading the scriptures about Christ Jesus prophesied in the Book of Isaiah, chapter 53:7-8 “Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter and like a lamb before its shearer is silent, so he opens not his mouth. In his humiliation justice was denied him. Who can describe his generation? For his life is taken away from the earth.”

The eunuch asks a burning question to the Apostle Philip, “How can I understand unless someone explains it to me?”

By building up Holy Spirit-filled Ethiopian Christians, who are strong in the Word of God, every person in this great nation will have an opportunity to receive the gospel in its fullness.

The Apostolic Ministries International (TAMI) had conducted a short term Bible School in 2009 and a man of God called Ps Ashabir Keteme was instrumental in organizing this Bible School. Last year Ps Prathiba Rao connected with him again and TAMI invited Ps Ashabir to visit Dubai. This visit was very significant as we decided to open mission fields in and around Ethiopia during 2016.

As part of the above decision TAMI decided to conduct a short Bible School in Hawassa in Ethiopia. Hawassa is the second largest city in Ethiopia and is 275 km from Addisababa

Ethiopian Bible School 2016 started on 11th April and was closed on 17th April 2016. More than 180 students attended the School of Discipleship, mostly youngsters. Over 90 percent of the disciples were between the age group 21 to 35. The students were highly disciplined, on time, eager to learn and hungry for God. Some were from the BEST Bible College in Addis.



Classes were taken on the following subjects: Word of God, Foundations of a Spirit Filled Christian Life, Rooted in love, and Healing through Deliverance, Forgiveness, Great Commission, Evangelism, Holy Spirit fruits and gifts, Evangelism, Five Fold Ministry and Church Planting.

Everyone who attended were truly blessed and many were eager to testify how practical the classes were and how the teachings changed their lives. Classes were taken mainly by Ps Alias, Ps Rao and Sister Annie

We also had a very powerful conference for 400 students from Hawassa University. The students have invited the TAMI team to come back for a bigger conference.

Ps Raju joined us for the last two days of the Bible School. On the last day we distributed gifts to the poor children.

On the 17th we had the graduation ceremony where teachers were gifted with Ethiopian traditional dress.

We have prayerfully presented certificates to all students who completed the course. Over 180 trained disciples committed to serve Jesus and the local church in the 5 fold ministry.

As a result of the Bible School, we are opening up mission outreach centers in Addis, Hawassa and 2 other places during the next 3 months.

Mombasa

A BLESSING CALLED MARIA

In the year 2006, Pastor Maria started a church in Mombassa – of course, she prefers to call it “His tabernacle” than “my church”. The church grew under the power of the Holy Spirit, with miracles and joyful testimonies of the members increasing and encouraging the community. One of the families that was greatly blessed during this time, was that of Miriam and her husband, who were facing a huge challenge and a severe demonic oppression – her husband had joined a devil worshipping group in the hope of improving their financial position and suddenly, their 12 year old son had gone missing. Miriam’s sister, Dorothy was a member of this church and she had introduced them to Pastor Maria for intercessory prayer and counselling.

During intercession, Pastor Maria received a revelation for this family, that the son had been kidnaped by a woman for a demonic sacrifice. The Lord also showed her that the boy was still alive – Pastor Maria broke forth in intercession and spiritual warfare on behalf of this young boy. The Lord also revealed to her that on the following Wednesday, this boy would return home to his parents. In the spirit realm, Pastor also saw a great confusion arising among the devil worshippers who were going to sacrifice the boy- as she and her prayer warriors persisted in prayer, she saw that the devil worshippers finally asked the woman to return the young boy, since he was now a threat to them. In her prayer Pastor could also see that the woman was reprimanded and warned by her group to never make such a mistake again.

Pastor shared this revelation with Mariam and John, who broke down and wept. As prophesied, their son was found on the road, confused but alive and well, The family started coming to church regularly and in the days that followed, they committed their lives to Jesus. In the days that followed, Mariam and John began ministering to some young men from a Masai tribe who lived in their vicinity. They were facing a problem and as Mariam shared her testimony with them, they wanted to meet Pastor Maria. “One day...two Masai guys dressed in their Masai attire became my visitors”, Maria recalls warmly. She brought them in and listened to their issue. She spoke to them about repentance and accepting Jesus as she prayed for them. During the prayer, the Lord revealed to her the person

who was responsible for their issue (a colleague) – she asked them to bring the man the next day. When they returned with him the following day, she told this man to repent of his sin and return their money. He did so and this convinced the Masai men that this could only be the work of God.

The Masai youth invited Pastor Maria to their Manyatta (traditional home where they worked) – the Masai tribes rely a great deal on witch doctors and witch craft. Often these witch doctors practice black magic to harm others and this had created fear and division among the people. Some of the people also saw demons and lived with demonic oppression and hopelessness. Pastor Maria visited the Manyatta with her team and on the first day itself, twenty nine out of ninety Masai gave their lives to Christ and received salvation. Initially, they started attending church and weekly services but since they had no source of regular income, this was not a viable option. Neither could Maria afford to bring seventy Masai to church every week due to lack of funds. Finally she started a weekly fellowship with them at their Manyatta. “God was so faithful”, she beams. The Masai were greatly blessed in the following months. They experienced change in their work, families, received healing and started believing in the power of Jesus.

There are still many challenges – the owners of these Manyattas are not Christian and they are opposed to church growing in the place of work – Masai attract a lot of tourists, so the owners do not want anything to change that. They finally agreed to allow a few church meetings in the Manyattas. Despite these constraints, the church has grown and twelve Masai received water baptism. Four more received water baptism when Pastor Raju and his team visited them last year. Pastor Maria and the Masai are now praying for a permanent place of worship for the Masai where there are no limits for them to be nourished spiritually. Without that it is getting difficult to continue having TAMI church meetings, she says. We pray that we will have a God inspired solution very soon even as we see more Masai come to His saving knowledge . Glory be to God.
