“ I have decided to follow Jesus, no turning back, Though none go with me, still I will follow, no turning back. The Cross before me, the world behind me, no turning back..”

William Reynolds arranged this beautiful tune in 1959, which became a popular hymn sung during Billy Graham crusades. Years down the line, we have sung it in churches and meetings and introduced it to our children in Sunday Schools. Inspiring lyrics and melodious tune which create fervor and passion in every heart that hears it.

Very few are aware that it was Sadhu Sunder Singh (1889-1929), who wrote the lyrics to this song !! Yes, the Sikh convert who renounced his religion to become a leading evangelist in India, training Indian missionaries, charged with a holy desire to spread the gospel in India. As he travelled through the country during the early 20th Century, with nothing but a New Testament Bible in his hand, he came across this gripping story, which he penned down into an Indian song.

During the 1800's, missionaries from other parts of the world, came to India, bringing the good news of salvation. Many Indians who became Christians, took on the mantle and moved on to spark one of the greatest revival movements in the North and the North East parts which were largely dominated by idolatry and pagan religions. Many of them were killed by “Head Hunters” who prided themselves on the number of heads that they collected and displayed on their property.

In one particular Garo village in Assam, North East India, known for its head hunting prowess, a man with his wife and two children, became a Christian – he was asked by the village

chief to renounce Jesus. Archers aimed their arrows at the two young sons, as the chief asked this man to give up his faith. The man stated “ I have decided to follow Jesus, and there is no turning back” .The archers shot the children down and now aimed at the wife. The man was asked again to renounce his faith. His answer “Though no one joins me, still I will follow”. The archers killed the wife and aimed at the man. He said “The cross before me, the world behind me”. They shot him dead as well. The Welsh missionary who had brought this family to Christ, witnessed this killing and the unyielding faith of this man. This display of faith led to the conversion of the village chief and the entire village. The Welsh missionary reported the event to Sadhu Sunder Singh who composed a song out of the dying declaration of this outstanding man, and these lyrics finally became the version of a song that we sing even today.....

So the next time you sing this song, take time to reflect how the gospel reached you personally – it took effort, time, love to see you saved – a friend, a family member, an acquaintance who reached out to you. Jim Caviezel, who played Jesus in The Passion of the Christ, was accidentally whipped twice, during the shooting, which led to hypothermia, lung infection and various other health issues. Jesus, who should medically have died during the lashes, “endured the cross for the joy that laid before him”- the joy – to see us saved and reconciled to the Father. The Garo man saw this Cross before him and the world behind him and decided “No turning back”

Love Changed My Life

LAYLAY MARCEL

I grew up as an orphan since both my parents died at a very young age, first my mother and then my father. I was left with nothing. I started to work as I had a deep desire to study. Till my high school, I could manage with my own earnings, but later it got very difficult, as I had no support from anywhere.

Christ Transformation

I was the only boy to the seven children my parents had. My sisters too, died at a very young age and being left with no one in my early twenties I decided to join the army. Just before even stepping forward, is when, in 1992, I received Christ as my personal Lord and Saviour. I have to say this, receiving Christ, gave me renewed hope. Today I pastor a church in Burundi and I glad I didn't pursue in joining the army.

My Early Life as a Christian

Being a Christian didn't change my external circumstances then. I still continued to live in the streets. Sometime, I would find shelter outside the church; other times alone Lake Tanganyika. Once, a family in the church offered to give me a place to sleep in their home.

But, within two years, a war broke out in Burundi and this had a huge impact on the people and in the city where I lived. Many people died and families started migrating to Tanzania and Congo. The family I stayed too, decided to migrate, but the Holy Spirit told me to stay in Burundi. So, I went back on to the streets, preaching the gospel.



The Start of a New Journey – Bible School.

In 2003, I had a deep desire to study English and to attend a bible school in English. This was the regular prayer of my heart during that time.

In 2004, I chanced upon an invitation to an English bible school. A friend of mine received the invitation to, 'Africa on Fire For Jesus', in Kenya - a Bible School by The Apostolic Ministries International (TAMI) from Pastor John Waweru in Kenya. As my friend wasn't able to go for it, he gave the invitation and with it the opportunity to attend the bible school.

Being in the bible school, I told whoever asked me how I had been invited, "It's God who invited me here!"

I Heard Those Words for the First Time

I received something so new and different. It was in the bible school, that both Pastor Alias and Pastor Pratibha Rao individually told me, "Lalay, I love you". Never have I heard those words in my entire lifetime, till that very day. This moved my heart and my life from then on was never the same.

It had never crossed my mind that someone like me, who had nobody and had nothing to offer could ever get married. I believed that I did not even know how to love anyone because I was at a place without love. When I felt the love of God at the Bible School, and when Pastor Prathibha Rao and Pastor Alias Jacob assured that they love me and will come to Burundi, it overwhelmed me to the point I started crying.

His Love in my heart, opened ways for my marriage

When I returned to Burundi, I had a desire to marry a girl and asked her family for her hand in marriage. Her family refused me by saying that I am an orphan and have nothing to offer their daughter. They told me that they were aware that I lived in the streets and refused to give their daughter to someone who did not have a home, a family and support. By the grace of God, finally my soon-to-be in-laws said that they would agree if I gave them USD 2000 for their daughter's hand in marriage. I somehow managed to collect and save up USD 1000, but it was not enough.

In 2008, during a Bible School in Congo, my father in Christ, Pastor Alias told me that he would help me get married and gave me the remaining money.

I returned to Burundi and by the grace of God, got married to Debora.

A Burden to Spread 'the Love' to Others

Until now, my wife has not seen even one member of my family. I cannot show her my origins or where I came from. So

I carry a big burden for the street children, because I know what a plight it is to be on the streets; and have a big burden for the orphans.

Today I have hope. Only God has helped me reach where I am today.

Before the Bible School experiences, I only knew French, but, today I speak a bit of English. I attended the Bible School in Kenya in 2004, in Uganda, Rwanda, Congo and Burundi in the following years. Through these five bible schools, the Holy Spirit helped me learn English, and fulfilled my desire.

Burundi Caritas Global School

I know this is the move of the Holy Spirit. A vision birthed from God through my Daddy Alias. I took the burden and decided to build the school up brick by brick, from foundation to the roof for the children of Burundi.

The 250 children we have currently enrolled in our school are just a drop in an ocean of need, but, I believe that God has planted a seed through us that will grow and satisfy every need. Through the education and opportunity we are providing them, our children at Burundi Caritas Global School will grow up to be leaders, pastors, prophets, teachers and apostles of tomorrow!

In the Mighty Name of Jesus Christ!

Caritas Global School, Bujumbura, Burundi, commenced on 14th September 2016. We had a total of 250 students for the first year. As of now, an overall of 7 classes are running, starting from nursery to P4, with 20 staffs. Mrs. Debora Laylay was appointed as the principal of the school.

Pastor Alias Jacob imparted the vision of the school and instilled the core values of the school in the hearts of all the staff and community members associated with the school. Annie Alias trained the staffs on holistic healing, deliverance and forgiveness.

By God's grace and, also because people from our churches in UAE and Canada supported financially, we were able to take with us uniforms, stationary and shoes for these children. Moreover, the enrolment was prioritized for orphans and street children. Our primary goals are to educate, unfold God-given-identity and restore the dignity of the children of Burundi. So for the initial year we are concentrating on bringing wholesome teaching to these children. The two doctors who had joined for the trip – Dr. Soumya and Dr. Jikky, conducted medical

campaigns. They had trained and taken classes on hygiene and health to make them aware of certain principles in clinical aspects. Furthermore, classes on “Love and Action” were taken by Neeti and the team - (Ajay, Neeti and Hannah). Megha took over to counsel the students in the school, and Bibu was in charge of media. Chisen Raju is appointed as the overall ambassador for the Burundi school.

Furniture for the classes are temporary; meanwhile the needful is done so that in a span

of two months, the children are facilitated with permanent classroom furniture. Toilet constructions are going, and a total of eight are allotted for boys and girls separately.

At present, our supply to this place is very limited in compared to their prerequisite. But, we have tremendous faith that God will inspire many more to join hands in whichever way possible to lavishly pour the best to the children who need nothing but the love of Jesus in action.





Small Things, Great Love

The term “street children” refers to children who live and work on the streets or in public market places. Many of these precious children find themselves in these situations as the result of poverty, war, abuse or other family issues. According to UNICEF, there are an estimated 100 million children living on the streets worldwide. These children usually have little or no supervision from adults; and out of desperation, many of them are forced to do things like beg and steal in order to survive. Some of them are recruited by organized criminal / terrorist movements. Children who live on the streets are unable to receive an education or proper healthcare. They are incredibly vulnerable yet hard to protect, making them an easy target for exploitation.

According to the World Health Organization, there are three types of street children:

- A child “of the streets”- these children have been abandoned by their family or are orphans with no surviving family members. They are solely responsible for their own survival. They have to find shelter and food however they can.
- A child “on the street”- these children have family and are in regular contact with them. Many of them spend their days on the streets in order to escape abuse or the overcrowding in their home. In some instances a child “on the street” is responsible for bringing in additional income for the family.

- A child of a street family – these children live on the streets with their families. Usually these families have come up against a tragedy or hardship like war, natural disaster, or simply unemployment.

Our beloved pastor / leader in Burundi was a street child who worked as a young boy to survive and ate from waste food on days that he could not earn anything. When I first met him in Kenya in 2004, he had never experienced a fatherly love. He used to attend our meetings every year. In 2009 I remember how happy he was when I flew from Dubai to Bujumbura to get him married to Debora. Today Lay Lay and Debora are our beloved children and they, along with Chrisen are championing the vision of Caritas Global School in Bujumbura, Burundi. Having a safe and secure place to live and learn, allows children to be children, and encourages their development into healthy teens and young adults. With a little bit of love and care Lay Lay is now impacting a nation. There are millions of children like him with no one to care, no one to love, none to feed or educate. May be we cannot solve all the problem, but we surely can do small things with great love for a few; and who knows what God can do through them. God can raise a Joseph, or a David or a Daniel or a Paul for this century. I encourage you to pray and support this vision!

With a joyful heart I write my testimony, for the privilege to be a part of Caritas Global School Burundi. For the last two years, I have desired to be a part of a mission trip, and finally it was worth the wait. As it is written in the Bible, "Not our plans, but His plans", that orchestrated this journey.

It was a pleasure and honor to work together with a big team and with Pastor Alias. I could feel the favour of God moving with me, all the way from Dubai to Bujumbura. My role was to do the media coverage and administration, which I did to the best of my ability being helped by the Holy Spirit.

In Acts 1-8 the scripture states "But you will receive power when the HOLY SPIRIT comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." God's work can be done in any form - and Caritas Global School in Burundi is one such wonder. Those little children in Gatumba, were all seeking love. They all needed a gentle touch, and hug which were beyond material benefits.

Till now, I have only seen and heard of African children in documentaries or in testimonies shared by others. But this trip was a real eye-opener for me to see the little kids how they survive mostly without anything.

A miracle that moved us was of a child, Chance, who wasn't able to register her name because her hand was bent and fingers folded. The teachers dismissed her because of this reason. We all came together then, and started praying for her. She was unable to lift her right hand for the past three years. I witnessed instant healing! Our God is an awesome God and by His stripes we are healed. Later, this very child was enrolled in the school with medical assistance as has lot of bruises on her legs.

Likewise, lot of other miracles took place by the power of Holy Spirit. Baptism was conducted for two days by Pastor Alias and Pastor Laylay. We had a chance to visit the widow homes. As a team we were empowered to do wonderful work for God's Kingdom. I once again thank the Lord Almighty, Pastor Alias, Pastor Laylay and all my team members. Special thanks to the leadership team of TAMI. Let us all work hand in hand with prayer and support.

Dr. Soumya George:

The Lord has made this journey to Burundi a blessed journey. His Perfect Will was seen in every situation, through our journey and planning. We saw children as small as two to three years of age that were under fear and bondages; some of them were tortured and punished in the form of burns on their faces; few others were brutally raped; some were given over to sacrifices, while the others had to see their parents being burnt alive in front of them. Those children have forgotten what pain feels like, and have forgotten hunger and thirst. They are not taught proper hygiene and most kids have oral infections, common cold, skin infections which have ulcerated but they can't feel nor express any pain. Some of them come hungry without eating for days.

The only thing we could do was tell them Jesus loves you and don't be scared. Being in the medical profession I learnt God can heal without medicines. We saw pneumonia, Down's syndrome, and spasticity being healed and recovered at the mention of Jesus. I learnt to first pray before seeing any patient; and God will treat and heal. There is a mighty move of the Holy Spirit in the school and the protection of the angels. We believe there is going to be an army rising for God in that school. There will be apostles, prophets, teachers, evangelists and pastors rising up from this school.

May His name alone be glorified!



Hannah Ealias:

I do believe that we are brought forward for such a time as this - God's perfect plan. This was my first mission trip. I have been praying to be a part of one for almost fifteen years, and finally my desire was granted. I was moved inside out, and truly saw God's hand through and during this trip to Burundi. Alice Thomas:

I am forever grateful to the Lord for enabling me to be a part of the Burundi Caritas Global School Mission trip. This was my first mission trip ever, I had not planned it but the Lord made sure that I was a part of this trip, as He moved the hearts of people at my work place for my leave approval. I have heard of mission trips and seen changed lives and was quite excited, but, I did not know what to expect or how to prepare myself for missions. From the day we started, we could see hurdles one after the other, but, more than that, we witnessed the faithfulness and protection of God in every step throughout till the end of the trip.

Burundi, though it looks barren, is a beautiful country, lively people for ever on their toes dancing and singing if given a chance. The children of Burundi will forever remain in my heart. Their smiles can light up a room even when their hearts ache for love and acceptance. It was the most humbling experience while among the kids as they swarmed around us for a touch and hug, more so, it was distressing to hear the painful past of the children and teachers. They have been through the most overwhelming hardships in their lives and can churn the hearts of any human. I believe, it is not that the Lord cannot heal the children of Burundi in a minute or not, that He cannot wipe away their tears in a second; I felt it was as though He had extended His arm towards us, allowing us to join Him in bringing help and healing, into the lives of the children and people of Burundi. I got to see and experience one part of the world where innocent children for no fault of theirs lack the basic necessities of life and are left abused, unloved and unwanted.

Personally, I had this amazing experience in one of the crusades when Pastor Alias asked us to come forward and pray for the people and children as soon as the Word was shared. I felt the love and compassion of Jesus just flow out as we reached out to the children and prayed for whomever we could lay hands on. It was most humbling and I was so blessed to be a part of what the Lord was doing and thanked Him for considering me.

There were a lot of experiences, testimonies and miracles that happened during the course of the week. In all these, only one thing remains, the magnitude and depth of Christ's love and compassion for these precious children was enormous. We started off not knowing what to do or from where to begin, but it all just ended up so organised. Back at the guest-house where we stayed, it was an altogether new experience, as we learned to live on limited resources from washing plates with minimal water to cooking with firewood. It was beautiful to



start the day with the team worshipping, sharing the word and having food together. The Lord just took over every single day and I praise Him for His unfailing love and companionship.

Leaving Burundi, I felt we just poured a drop of water into those needy hands. The task is big and only the Lord in all His magnificent glory and understanding knows how to restore the land and people of Burundi. Proverbs 15:15 says: “the cheerful of heart has a continual feast”. The Burundi church is a celebrating church. Early Saturday morning 33 Burundians, in an act of faith and obedience to the commands of Christ were being baptized by Pastor Alias and



Pastor Laylay in the waters of the magnificent Lake Tanganyika. Church members would run with flowers to greet each newly baptized brother and sister, dancing with them in celebration. On the banks of the lake, shouts of jubilating praise rang through the air as believers danced in rhythm to the beats of the African drum.





The Sunday Worship service at Apostolic Church Burundi was an explosion of extravagant praises. The church danced and celebrated like it was a wedding feast. I'd say our church in Bujumbura can out beat a Zumba fitness routine any day.

The church also conducted two days of Crusades which was powerful and spectacular. The Royal Drum Dance of Burundi attracted crowds to the crusade ground. We witnessed a special dance by the orphan children, celebration by the widows and the women by our church in Burundi under the leadership of Pastor Laylay. Our team of twelve also took part with action songs by the missions' team from Apostolic church Dubai. Many men, women and children, hungry for the Word of God ran to the altar after receiving the Word and altar call from Pastor Alias.

Each of us had the opportunity to pray for the sick among them and witness miracles, healing in the body and restoration of the soul. It was a truly humbling experience.

Words would run dry to convey all that we saw, felt and experienced in Burundi. I've fallen in love with the people of this wonderful land. Many kids have no mom, no dad, no home, ill health and very limited access to food or water. Also, the men and women there face traumas and have none to take care of them too. Still, I see thankful hearts, jubilant praises and hunger just for a touch. I am humbled to see that people who possess nothing in terms of earthly possessions can raise such an incense of praise with an aroma that fills the heavens like sweet perfume. Today, I can pray for the nation of Burundi with clarity and a renewed passion. My prayer is also that Caritas Global School - Burundi will be an Oasis of love and compassion; a true blessing to the nation of Burundi.



Annie Alias:

The mission trip to Burundi was a beautiful experience for me, so because of the guaranteed guidance of the Holy Spirit, from the start to the end. I believe the vision Caritas Global School is an undoubted inspiration from the Holy Spirit, and it is diligently sought after by a wonderful leader that TAMI is so blessed with, Pastor Laylay Marcel. He has got great burden for the orphans and the street children of Burundi. The school can accommodate only 250 children, who just long for a touch of love, are given the opportunity to have good education, which will change their destiny. Whatever we are investing in to Caritas Global School, in Burundi, will bear fruit.

The purpose of the school is to give identity to every orphan and abandoned child and to mold them as people without fear, guilt, shame and bitterness. So we have conducted teaching sessions in similar to these topics, as to help them receive their deliverance from the Word of God. Isaiah 55: 11 says: “so shall be my word that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed for the thing for which I send it.” (ESV).

One of the testimonies that stand out to me, through these teaching sessions was of a teacher, Mr. Alex. As a young child he was thrown out of his house by his father and never received love. His father treated him differently from his other siblings, and so he grew up with hatred in his heart towards his him. For nearly 12 years, Alex denied any sort of communication with his father and was full of bitterness toward



him. But, things took a different turn when the message of love was preached and taught at the session for training teachers and leaders. He was touched by the Spirit of God through the Word and decided to forgive his father. The next day as he met his father in the street, he was able to hug him and talk to him with love. God moved his father's heart wonderfully that he became so certain to give Alex a share of his property. What an amazing God we serve!

Apart from that, a woman who attended the meeting, decided to forgive her husband, who took away everything she had and finally abandoned her. Only the Spirit of God can change the hearts of people.

Though we were a group of inexperienced people, God used each one of us, to pour out love and compassion to the children. When we are available to God and willing to give ourselves into His hands, the little we have will be multiplied. The words of Jesus in Mark 9:37 says: “Whoever receives one such child in my name receives me, and whoever receives me, receives not me but him who sent me.” (ESV).



Dr. Jikky John:

Like most of them, this was my first mission trip too, to serve and to be served by the people of Burundi. I went to Burundi, thinking that I would be of some help to them. Yes! God used each one of us as per his mighty plan, and I am grateful to God for it. However, I was equally touched and enlightened in my spirit, when I experienced the love and innocence of the children in Burundi. Though they lacked so much, I saw heaven in their eyes. I also thank Pastor Alias for my inclusion in the Caritas Global School Team.

I am happy to share few testimonies, which opened my eyes;

- One morning, while doing medical examinations on the students, a child was brought to us, complaining of stomach pain. The child was diagnosed with gastric irritation due to starving. We gave this child a banana to eat and as he was eating, another child from the streets came begging for a bite. The boy who was already suffering from hunger, without any hesitation shared his banana with the little one. This miracle of sharing in the midst of starvation moved my Spirit.
- Later that day when lunch was served for the school children, there were many other children standing outside the school, hoping to get a morsel of food. Understanding the situation, the school authorities lay the lid of the cooking vessel on the ground, and started pouring the extra food on the lid and asked the street children to come and take the food. Each child came and took a handful of



food, went back and called another child, who did not get. I was thinking the child could have grabbed the food, with both the hands after all what he has got in his one hand is barely anything. But, he chooses to give that opportunity to another child, who didn't get. The kindness of Jesus was overflowing through them.

- Similarly, on our way to Congo boarder, our car stopped so we could fetch some water or a soothing drink. A group of street children gathered around our car. Seeing their plight, we thought of sharing our lemonade with them. Each child took one mouth and went behind to call the other one, who did not get. None of them came the second time, even though they badly wanted more.

• While doing medical examination, we came across a girl, who had severe facial swelling, due to infected teeth. The swelling was spreading all over the left side of the face, including the lower border of the eye lids. It was an emergency case that needed immediate attention. We addressed the case to the teachers, and since they didn't have money, they asked us to pray. We prayed for the child. Next day when we saw her for registration, the swelling had disappeared and she was healed. All glory and praise to God our father who is a Father to the fatherless and the widows (Psalms 68: 5).

- Pastor Laylay brought to us a 6 month old child who as suffering from breathing problem. Dr. Soumya checked the baby and understood that she was suffering from severe breathing difficulty, chest congestion which can lead to pneumonia, she had the symptoms of Down



syndrome (her neck was not holding straight, and she was unable to focus). We prayed over this child. The very next day when we saw the child, his breathing became normal, chest condition improved tremendously and he started moving his eye ball and focusing better. This was an instant healing in front of my eyes by power of Holy Spirit.

I felt the Holy Spirit was ministering to me through these verses, Luke 3-11, "If you have two shirts, give one to the poor. If you have food, share it with those who are hungry....".

Isaiah 58-7 "Share your food with the hungry, give shelter to the homeless and give clothes to those who need them". Romans 12-13, 16, "when God's people are in need, be ready to help them. Always be eager to practice hospitality. Be of the same mind towards one other. Do not set your mind on high things, but associate with the humble."

I also take this opportunity to thank the leaders of TAMI and all church members for their prayer and support. God bless you all.





Caritas Global School Faislabad

DARSHAN MASIH

The Caritas Global School in Faislabad, Pakistan was started on 7th April 2015. It has 124 students and 6 teachers – these children from different religious backgrounds, are orphans, street kids, and children from broken families.

“I know what it is to be poor”, says Pastor Darshan Masih, who founded this school. His humble start planted in him, the desire to build a school for the underprivileged children. In 2014, when Pastor Alias spoke about his vision of 200 Caritas schools all around the world, Pastor Darshan knew he had to be a part of it.

The school (Nursery to Grade 5) has 3 rooms, 1 hall, 2 toilets and a store/canteen area which sells food at a very low rate. Admission is free for all children and Pastor Darshan’s church provides stationary. Fifty percent of the cost of books and uniform is funded by the parents and the rest by the church. School kids sit on floor due to lack of furniture. It is a humble start with so much yet to be done, but Darshan Masih believes it will grow because it is his desire to see that “no child is left behind”.





REACHING THE UNREACHED

CAMEROON LOVE MISSION

Centuries ago, God spoke through Prophet Isaiah, “So shall My Word be that goes forth from My mouth; It shall not return to Me void, but it shall accomplish what I please, and it shall prosper in the thing for which I sent it.” Isaiah 55:11

We are truly grateful to God and everyone else who played even the simplest role to see great things happen in Cameroon. A Mission Team of five (four from Dubai and Pastor Rodney from Zanzibar), reached Yaounde, Cameroon on Saturday the 27th of August 2016. Pastor Caleb -The President of Cameroon All Pastors Association and Pastor Daniel Batela -

TAMI Cameroon Leader and elders of Church received us with great Love. The very evening, we, along with Pastor Daniel and 15 other local missionaries set out on a mission to reached the unreached Pygmies land in the Eastern forest region of Cameroon. This group of us consisted of, interpreters, pastors, medical professionals, agriculture and irrigation professionals, civil construction professionals, Global school teachers, worshipers and musicians etc. But, the highlight was, we all reached the Pygmies only the next day morning, as it was a total of 13 hours journey. Also, it wasn't an easy journey, there wasn't electricity, and we had to get off the bus nearly seven times to lift it off the ditches. Moreover, the destination can only be reached with the help of a very tender and not-strong-enough ferryboat. If ever

we tend to lose the balance, we would have fallen into the River Jah that is full of ferocious crocodiles. God's mercy and protection was so tangible through this. Fortunately, we were abled by the Holy Spirit to meet the officials of that region and obtain the needful permissions in respects to spreading love and the gospel, and for the school. We then headed to the Mayor's residence for some rest and breakfast.

Sunday being the service oriented day, we all attended the church at Ngyola, Lelen and Dimako Villages. The students of Caritas Global School and the church members received us with joy and love. We ministered and enjoyed the presence of the Lord together. In the evening, we had a crusade in Ngyola Church, with an attendance of 250 members from the surrounding villages. The students of our school led the worship. We presented the Word in the leading of the Holy Spirit and witness signs and wonders take place so massively. Many were delivered of unclean spirits; awe for God gripped all who were gathered. Healing was evident and many among them gave their lives to Christ.

On Monday and Tuesday, we had our group split into two, and conducted morning prayers at Ngyola and Lelen Church. We saw a hunger in the people gathered, soon after the morning prayers, we were invited to the Mayor's home for breakfast. We dispersed with thanksgiving for the love and hospitality extended by his family. We then engaged ourselves evangelizing, preaching, teaching and proclaiming healing in the villages. The Gospel was preached to 10 Villages of the Eastern region including 3 Pygmies villages.

The villagers were receptive, received us and responded to the gospel with love. We saw Acts of the Apostles come alive, as those, "who had practiced sorcery brought their scrolls together and burned them publicly. (Acts 19:19). The village doctor,

who was practicing witchcraft, brought out his tiger skin and associated paraphernalia and handed them to us. We burnt these in the sight of the whole village. Great repentance came up on the villagers. They all cried as there was a thick anointing of the Holy Spirit, which led these repented hearts to turn to Jesus. Later in the evenings, we also had open air meetings and people from the surrounding villages, who came out of curiosity, received salvation and physical healing.



After the evening crusade on 30th August, the team left Ngyola by around 6.00pm and headed for the capital city. On Wednesday, we prepared ourselves to visit the central prison with the permission of the officials. The beauty of going there was we saw a group of about 160 inmates worshipping God as we arrived at the jail. Pastor Rao ministered and encouraged the inmates with his personal testimony and powerful Word. We also gifted them with bags of rice, oil, and soap, which we took with us from here (Dubai). The very same day we had the met with the pastors and business delegators of Cameroon. We saw God unite hearts to take the dream of reaching the unreached forward. During this time, we also had the ordination of Brother Irwin as a Pastor.

Our final day in Cameroon was beginning by visiting the TAMI Church in Yaoundé, which is under construction. We sowed seeds of prophetic words and trusted the Holy Spirit to take complete control to bring about a massive change through the church. Pastor Rao specifically gave a prophetic word that TAMI Cameroon, would serve as a base to touch and penetrate in to North African Nations.

Heading back was quiet sad, as though the whole journey kept us very occupied.



Just being handpicked by God to shed love to the pygmies was indeed the best privilege. We received and released the best that God wanted us to, as the Holy Spirit worked profoundly among these Cameroonians. John 6:63, "It is the Spirit who gives life; the flesh profits nothing. The words that I speak to you are spirit, and they are Life."

In conclusion it was great Joy to be part of the Father's great move to see that His children, who are lost in darkness are rescued, liberated and brought back to the Loving Family. For we all belong to God's Big family, and we have an obligation to see that the touch of Jesus reaches to people who are completely negated. We also need to demonstrate His love that has been poured out into our hearts by the Holy Spirit, to pull down and burn strongholds of darkness and release the light of Jesus into these villages - thus fulfilling the vision, "reaching the unreached ethnic groups". Likewise, we all have a role to play to see that the kingdoms of this world become the Kingdom of our Lord and Saviour Christ Jesus. Revelation 11:15, "Then the seventh angle sounded: And there were loud voices in heaven, "The kingdoms of this world have become the Kingdom of our Lord and His Christ, and He shall reign forever and ever!"

► Testimonies of the TAMI churches:

TAMI Ngoyla church: They testified of having never experienced such a great crusade of gathering unto the Lord, in the history of the church in that region.

TAMI Lelene church: The church testified how for the first time they had to receive foreign guests in their community. They were so touched by the simplicity of the love team. They were so thankful to the Lord for the deliverance, spiritual revival and hope that was brought to their community by TAMI.

TAMI Dimako church: They testified that they have never experienced the kind of love manifested towards them by the love mission team, ever since the death of the Roman Catholic priest who brought the people of this village together, about 40 years ago. They were marginalized by other communities and treated as slaves. Their kids don't go to school. They were paid a glass of rice for a day's labor. The fellowship and love shown by the love team overwhelmed them especially as the Pastors from Dubai helped to serve the food that was cooked by the pygmies to everyone.

► Testimonies after the Crusade: The praise and worship done by the praise team during the morning dew encounters, and the crusades in the evenings, brought down a tremendous presence of God that healed many. The encounters produced reconciliations amongst certain families, individuals, villages; and particularly the traditional leaders of villages, and the government authorities.

► Testimonies of Villages: In most of the villages, the women complained of suffering from the attacks of sexual abuse, physically and spiritually. After their encounter with the Lord, many testified of deliverance they experienced of themselves and their children, from unclean spirits that defiled them physically; in their dreams.

Mabam village testified of their deliverance from the stronghold of darkness and witchcraft.

► The Sub-Divisional Officer of Ngoyla and The Mayor of Ngoyla: They testified of a peaceful atmosphere and of a great light that has broken forth and reigns, over the city of Ngoyla, upon the arrival of the love mission team till date.



RWANDA

Mission

I was assured that the church in Rwanda, Kigali belongs to TAMI. They purchased a land and built a church which can accommodate nearly 200 people.

I had arrived just in time for their 2nd service on Sunday, and was welcomed with so much of gratitude. Pastor Enoch and his team in Kigali has declared, and are very pleased to be a part of TAMI, and considered me to be their fatherly figure for spiritual covering. These people are very grateful for the little that Pastor Rao and the rest of us could do for them.





During a day of the week, we had visited the home of lady named Uwamahoro Pelagy. This wonderful woman grew up without both her parents. Her Father had abandoned her mom and her at a very early age. Her mother remarried and her step-father, instead of fulfilling the role of a loving father, raped her repeatedly. Due to such agony she left home and got into prostitution. Later, a man came into her life and assured to love her. But, soon after she had five kids he abandoned her. This left her to choose her old profession. During that course, one of her friends asked her to attend Pastor Enoch's church. Miraculously the Lord touched her, and she confessed her sins and accepted Jesus as her personal Saviour. Not knowing how to earn a living, Pastor Enoch, arranged tailoring training for her and over 25 other women like her.



After the training a sewing machine was gifted to her and today is living a wonderful life making her living as a tailor. She makes \$2/day, which suffices enough to feed her five children. But, education is way out of the question as she cannot afford to that for her children.

At present, our TAMI Rwanda church has another 40 Christian woman who were once prostitutes that need training and sewing machines. I am amazed at this ministry there and was truly blessed to be a part.



I also visited a slum area in Rwanda and personally participated in the Feed the Poor Kids Program. Every day except Sunday - our church feeds about 150 children one meal a day. Kids are taught simple things before and after the meal, "for man shall not live by bread alone but buy every word that proceeds from the mouth of God" – (Matthew 4: 4)

An evening I had met all the key leaders and elders of the Tami church in Kigali, and explained to them about TAMI and its vision. After that they expressed the challenges they often face. Just in the progress of sharing we started to build strong relationships. I assured them about how TAMI regularly prays for them; and how we are willing to serve them! They were all very happy to be part of the family.

During the evenings of the two days, from 4:30 pm to 7 pm, we had Open Air revival meetings where many people from the street heard the gospel and gave their life to Jesus. Many healings and deliverance took place. Many drug addicts' / call girls gave their lives to Jesus. There was great joy in that area.



A pastor called Marie (lady) from Goma, Congo came for the meeting. She has a church of 150 people in Goma, Congo. To my surprise she was a student of Burundi Bible School, before. In 2006 or 2007 she had planted a seed at the Africa on fire for Jesus as she desired to be part of TAMI. She was in Rwanda but her husband was transferred to Goma. When she went there she started a church. I told her that she is welcome into TAMI family. She was in tears as her SEED offering and the long wait was now coming to reality.



Two years back I had met Pastor Enoch and gave him the vision of Caritas School. He carried the vision and started a Nursery School with 3 small classrooms and 3 teachers. The School is a great impact in the society and the public are demanding for Primary school. Pastor Enoch did not ask me for funding, and acted on the vision. I just discovered that Godly vision has power. Write it on a tablet. When someone catches the vision, he will run!

What I am going to report now broke my heart! On Thursday I visited a TAMI village church in a place called BUSANZA, and there met an amazing pastor by the name Faustin Munyaneza.

He was taking care of 8 HIV patients of whom one was a child aged 10. All of them are rejected by their relatives and the society. No one is there to help them with a job, food, or home. This pastor along with Pastor Enoch looks after them and shares whatever food they have. They are all believers who attend our TAMI church in Busanza. Since, they had no bibles we gave the cash to buy each one a Bible. I gave a word, "Jesus is in them - He said whatever you do to the least of My brethren you do it to Me. So who is in them? Jesus!" They loved the word and so glad that someone came to visit them. They mentioned that there are hundreds more like them, totally deserted. Just one among them died two days ago and everyone was preparing to go to the funeral.

I am not the same Pastor Alias who went to Rwanda! I am completely changed by a new side of His love! Changed by His hearts cry! Millions are waiting for the revealing of the sons of God!



DIVINE APPOINTMENT IN DELHI DARBAR



It was a beautiful morning in Delhi and I was getting ready to go out to Red Fort along with Pastor Rinku after a delicious breakfast prepared by Sally Aunty.
